MINUTES August 3, 2023

OPENING: The regular scheduled meeting of the Board of Health opened at 6:00 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment.

MINUTES

Dr. Putnam made a motion to accept the minutes from July 6, 2023 with edits. Ms. Brzoska seconded the motion. The roll call vote was unanimous in favor to approve.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES' REPORTS

DISCUSSION

Mr. Hibert updated all current permit applications and will print them for the Board members to vote on the changes at the next meeting.

Backup Inspector- Mr. Hibert would like to appoint Crystal Dugay as a back-up Health Inspector. The back-up Inspector would fill in when Mr. Hibert is unable to conduct inspections due to days off or heavy workload. Mr. Hibert will draft a letter for Ms. Brzoska to sign at the next meeting that explains what Ms. Dugay can do in his absence.

Ms. Brzoska made a motion to appoint Crystal Dugay as a backup inspector based on Mr. Hibert's high recommendation. Dr. Putnam seconded the motion. The roll call vote was unanimous in favor to approve.

465 North Loomis Street- Mr. Hibert said that applications were submitted for this property and explained that the system was installed in the 1980's and there are no records on file for this system. The system has a tank, distribution box and 2 seepage pits and started to experience some breakout into the lawn in 2021. The homeowners hired Bruce Cooper to pump the tank, add ventilation to the seepage pits, aeration to the tank and a small trench to the system. No perc test was done and the Health Department was not made aware of this work. Mr. Cooper did not have a Southwick Installer's license and is in violation of both Title 5 and the Southwick Board of Health regulation. The homeowners recently had a Title 5 inspection done and Mr. Hibert was contacted to inspect the site. He stated that the system met failure criteria and explained it to the owners. The owners have had a new septic designed and Mr. Cooper has applied for a conditional license to do the work, at the behest of Mr. Hibert. Mr. Hibert feels it would be fair to the homeowners to allow Mr. Cooper to have a temporary license to fix his mistake.

Ms. Brzoska made a motion to approve the Hauler's and Installer's License application and to allow Cooper Excavating to do one job in town. Dr. Putnam seconded the motion. The roll call vote was unanimous in favor to approve.

PHE Grant - Mr. Hibert said they had a meeting on Tuesday. They are in the process of finalizing all of the funding for this year. They are going to hire a shared Service Coordinator that will be posted once the budget and contract are finalized.

Mr. Hibert asked the Board if they would like to continue meeting once a month. Ms. Brzoska asked him to speak with Mr. Steinhart and Ms. Hill to make sure that is okay.
