## **PUBLIC HEARING**

Mr. Barry Searle, R.S.

RDA 187 Vining Hill Road The legal ad was published in the Reminder Publication on November 4, 2020. Mr. Searle presented a plan to repair a failed septic system at the location. The leach field will be removed, but the septic tank will remain. The repair will be outside of the 50 foot Buffer Zone, but within the 100 foot Buffer Zone. The system has been in failure for some time. The new leach field CC 11162020

will be smaller and function as a pre-treatment system. Commissioner Drenen made a motion for a negative determination on the project. Commissioner Mizanoglu seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follows:

RDA Fish & Boating Person The legal ad was published in the Reminder Publication on November 4, 2020. Mr. Camron presented a plan for replacing the decking on the fishing pier at Middle Pond. The original construction did not live up to its life expectancy. The replacement wood does not require stain or treatments. Chairman Pratt made a motion for a negative determination on the project. NOI 12 Noble Steed DEP #292- Chairman Pratt opened the Public Hearing by reading the legal as posted in the Reminder Publications on 11/4/2020. Mr. Levesque stated that the project was a single family dwelling with plantings in the Bordering Vegetation Wetland (BVW). The plans showed plantings within 50 feet of the Buffer Zone, but Mr. Levesque explained that the plantings were actually going to be located between the 100 and 50 foot Buffer Zone. Previous comments from the DEP were made under the presumption that the jurisdictional area is BVW, but it was confirmed that the jurisdictional area is IVW and only jurisdictional under Wetland Local Bylaws. Hearing no comments or concerns, Chairman Pratt made a motion to close the Public Hearing at 7:21. Commissioner Patria seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follows:

NOI DEP# 292-0374 115 Fred Jackson Road (Continuation) Mr. Levesque presented a revised plan showing 3 culvert installations along the driveway. The lot was delineated a few years ago for a Forest Cutting Plan. Mr. Levesque spoke with the landowner who said that there are no current or future plans to subdivide the parcel into 4 building lots. The current plans are for two single family dwellings, one for each of the owners. The Commissioners agreed to a site visit to review any

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wetlands and areas that will require replication. Chairman Made a motion for a continuation of the Public Hearing until December 7, 2020. Commissioner Patria seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follows:

691 College Highway – Dollar General Coordinator Clark stated that before the 2013 NOI was submitted some mowing was mistakenly conducted through a wetland and self-reported in the NOI. At that time the DEP issued an Administration Consent Order with Penalties. The area has since been restored and the DEP has released ACOP with approval for the Commission to issue a Certificate of Compliance. Commissioner Mizanoglu made a motion to release the bond on the property and approve a Certificate of Compliance. Chairman Pratt seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follows:

<u>Public Land Preservation Act</u> The Conservation Commission members agreed to send another letter to Congressman Boldyga requesting sponsorship. There are several parcels of land dedicated to "Open Space" that in actually can be developed due to the Special Permit omitting that the land will remain in Open Space for perpetuity. The Conservation Commission will need to work with the Planning Board members and future developers to ensure that Open Space remains just that.

<u>New England Scenic Trail</u> Coordinator Clark stated that due to a staffing switch the project will be starting November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Swamp Trail** Coordinator Clark noted that there was no new progress on the project. Now that Mr. Grannells is back to good health, Coordinator Clark may enlist his opinion as a professional engineer.

<u>Norm Cheever, LMC</u> Mr. Cheever reported that salt was going to be used on the roadways this winter instead of sand. The LMC is concerned that the salt may be detrimental to the lake water.

<u>Town Hall Meeting Protocol</u> As of this meeting, there have been no improvements in the status of Covid 19. Town Hall attendance is still restricted.
