Dear Members of the Board:

On behalf of New England Disc Golf Center (NEDGC) we submit the following information concerning the pending application for a seasonal alcohol license for the premise at 51 John Mason Road in Southwick.

NEDGC opened in 2016 and has operated without issues. During peak season NEDGC averages 200-250 rounds weekly. There is no lighting and the facility closed at dusk. The requested hours for the license are Monday thru Friday 2:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. / Saturday 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. / Sunday Noon to 6:00 P.M. The requested hours of operation are significantly lower than a more traditional licensed premises (golf course). The staff has experience in the sale and secure of alcohol. All staff will be TIPS trained.

NEDGC underwent a lengthy and detailed review by the Southwick Planning Board that voted to amend their special permit to include the sale of alcoholic beverages. We submit the intensive review and vote by the Planning Board clearly addresses the issues of appropriateness and suitability of a license at this location, its potential impact on the neighborhood and the issue of traffic. In voting to amend the Special Permit the Planning Board found that NEDGC met all of the criteria of Chapter 185, Section 9 of the Southwick Zoning Ordinance (please see Exhibit A). This includes the compatibility with the character and scale of other permitted uses in the same district, that it will not constitute a nuisance nor create traffic congestion or impair pedestrian safety, among other factors.

At the initial Select Board hearing on this application there was both significant support and opposition for the pending application NEDGC submitted a petition in support and a group of residents through their counsel submitted a petition in opposition. Please note the following concerning the petition by the opposition. All signatures on their petition were secured over a year ago. None of the residents who signed the petition knew the details of NEDGC's application. Upon information and belief by clients several of those people signed the petition based on the misinformation that there would be a bar at the premises. In addition, it is important

NO actual abutters to the property signed the petition. NEDGC's application does not include request for a bar or bar stools.

While we believe the detailed review by the Planning Board in voting to amend the Special Permit should give the Select Board a level of comfort that a license is not only appropriate at this location, but the issuance of a license is also consistent with licenses previously issued to Edgewood Golf Course, the Ranch Golf Course, the former Southwick Country Club, and the American Legion Post since all are or were located on the Residential 40 (R40) zone as NEDGC.

The applicant has committed to all staff being TIPS Certified and that everyone must show ID to be served. Signs will be posted notifying everyone that no outside alcohol may be brought on the premises. In addition, if a patron orders two beverages the other person must be present and show ID. The impact of this license will be significantly less than other commercial recreational premises in R40 zones that currently exist or were licensed by the Town of Southwick.

While the action of the Planning Board may provide comfort to the Select Board as to the appropriateness of a license in this location, the investigation into the character experience and fitness of the applicant along with the type impact of the proposed license is clearly the jurisdiction of the Select Board. We submit that the applicant is qualified, and that this application is appropriately located. We request the approval of the Select Board of the Town of Southwick of this application.

Finally, I would strongly suggest whether the applicant qualifies under MGL Chapter 138, and the rules and regulations of Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (ABCC) for this type of license is the jurisdiction of the ABCC and should be determined by the ABCC is the Select Board deems this application appropriate.

Chapter 185. Zoning

Article IV. Use Regulations

§ 185-9. Special permits.

[Added STM 11-21-1991 by Art. 14]

- A. Where a special permit may be authorized by a special permit granting authority under this chapter, said authority may grant, upon written application, such special permit if it finds, among other things, that:
 - (1) The proposed use would be suitably located in the neighborhood in which it is proposed and/or the total Town.
 - (2) The use will be reasonably compatible with the character and scale of other uses permitted as of right in the same district.
 - (3) The use will not constitute a nuisance by reason of an unacceptable level of air or water pollution, excessive noise or visually flagrant structures and accessories.
 - (4) The proposed use will not constitute a substantial inconvenience or hazard to abutters, vehicular traffic or pedestrians.
 - (5) Adequate and appropriate facilities will be provided for the proper operation of the proposed use, including special attention to safe vehicular circulation.
 - (6) The proposed use shall comply with the sign regulations specified in this chapter.
 - (7) The proposed use shall comply with any and all additional special permit criteria or special use regulations imposed on individual uses in this chapter.
 - (8) The proposal will not create traffic congestion or impair pedestrian safety. Provision shall be made for convenient and safe vehicular and pedestrian circulation within the site and in relation to adjacent streets, property or improvements.
 - (9) The proposed project shall not create a significant adverse impact to the quality of surface water or groundwater during and after construction, and provision shall be made for maximizing groundwater recharge.
 - (10) The design of the project shall provide for adequate methods of disposal of sewage, refuse or other wastes generated by the proposed use.
 - (11) The design of the project shall minimize the visibility of visually degrading elements and protect the neighboring properties from potentially detrimental or offensive uses through the use of screening or vegetated buffer zones.
 - (12) In reviewing site plans submitted with a special permit application, the special permit granting authority shall consider the site plan submittal and approval requirements of this chapter.
