
BROWN BAG DISTRIBUTION

Mid January: The Southwick Senior Center is creating a Companion Program. The program will assist frail, homebound adults aged 60 and older. Program services will include transportation to medical appointments for a small fee, grocery shopping assistance, errands, and companionship. These services are provided to recipients by dedicated volunteers who receive reimbursement for their gas mileage. The reward for the companion volunteer is knowing that you are making a difference in the life of a Senior Citizen who needs assistance.

If you are interested in becoming a volunteer or if you feel you may quality to be a client in this program please call the Senior Center. There will be required training for the volunteer and a criminal background check will be completed. Companions do not have to be Seniors. Please call the Senior Center to sign up.

Getting Ready for Tax Season

After the holiday season it's time to get ready for tax season! Once again AARP Tax Aide Program volunteers will come to our Senior Center on Tuesdays beginning February 8th, to prepare federal and state tax returns. If more days are added we will post it on Channel 15. Call the office at 569-5498 to make your appointment beginning on January 6, 2022. Tax Aide is a nationwide free, confidential service offered to low and middle income taxpayers of all ages with special attention to those 60 and older. All tax preparers are unpaid volunteers! They have shared a few important guidelines to remember if you want to use this service.

Because of concerns about identity theft, the AARP Tax Aide program requires that each taxpayer show a valid picture ID. If you have a joint return then both spouses must be present, unless one is ill or disabled, please tell us if this is your situation when you make your appointment.

It is very important to bring all your 2020 tax related documents with you, as well as a copy of last year's tax return. So be sure to watch your mailbox in January when most Social Security, wage, and retirement account statements are sent to you. Remember that if you have a brokerage account those statements may not come until mid-February. Keep these dates in mind when you make your appointment. The program tries to serve as many as possible and spots fill up fast so it can be difficult to schedule a return visit to bring missing documents.

At this time we anticipate being able to return to in person appointments for tax preparation. If things change and we must return with COVID restrictions you will be notified.

Steps to follow:

Call the office to schedule a date for tax completion beginning on January 6th

A confirmation letter, instruction sheet, and intake form will be mailed to all schedule participants in advance of their appointment. These documents must be completed before your appointment. If paperwork is incomplete then you will need to schedule an appointment on another day if one is available. Please plan on a minimum of 90 minutes for your appointment.

If there are extenuating circumstances due to COVID that will not allow you to meet with a tax preparer in person we will do our best to accommodate your situation with a drop off program.

FUEL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION: You must call the

office to make an appointment to fill out the fuel assistance application. To help make your application process more efficient please make sure you bring in the following items: All Income (social security, retirement, and 1099 bank statements), Electric Bill, Oil or Gas Bill, Water Bill, Real Estate Tax bill, Homeowners Coverage, Photo ID, and 4 weeks of consecutive employment pay stubs if applicable. Please have document organized and ready to photo copy. These documents are required by Valley Opportunity not the Senior Center. The Senior Center assists you in filling these applications out. We do not make the decisions regarding fuel assistance. Your information remains confidential and a file is not kept in our office it is sent to Valley Opportunities. Please call the office to schedule an appointment at (413)569-5498. If you are not comfortable coming into the Senior Center please call and we will set up a time for you to drop off your documents and we will call you when your documents are ready to picked up.


