Special April Programs:

The Only Winner in War is Medicine - April 3 @ 6:30 pm. Dr. Andrew Lam will present a look at how WWII spurred rival surgeons to invent new techniques that saved lives in postwar America. An in-depth look at the mavericks, moments, and mistakes that sparked the greatest medical discoveries in modern times-plus the cures that will help us live longer and healthier lives in this century...and beyond. In the Masters of Medicine, Dr. Lam distills the long arc of medical progress down to the crucial moments that were responsible for the world's greatest medical miracles. He brings to life heroic tales of embattled mavericks who endured ridicule and sometimes risked their own lives to conceive the incredible life-saving cures we depend on, and often take for granted, today. This riveting ode to mankind expertly highlights the battle against deaths from heart attacks, diabetes, infection, cancer, trauma, and childbirth; revealing why the past is prelude to the gamechanging breakthroughs of tomorrow. The Lincoln Assassination with Christopher Daley - April 16 @ 6 pm Richmond has fallen, General Robert E. Lee has surrendered; the Civil War was ending. And then, Abraham Lincoln was plucked from this earth as if his mission here had been accomplished –to keep the United States united...to preserve the Union! This lecture is the result of many years of research and travel. The presentation begins with a short synopsis of the backdrop of the Civil War leading into a discussion about the plot to kidnap Lincoln and how that plot developed into a scheme to assassinate the President. Next, the movements of both Lincoln and Booth during the day of the assassination are meticulously chronicled using a simultaneous timeline. Then the assassination is recounted in stunning detail. Subsequently, the escape of and capture of John Wilkes Booth is fully described. Finally, the talk concludes with a vivid description of the trial of all of the conspirators and execution of four-Mary Surratt, Lewis Powell, David Herold, and George Atzerodt.
