Western Massachusetts Hilltown Hikers (in person)— September 22, 6:30pm— This presentation will describe the locations of several beautiful and natural public hiking trails that are located in the Southern Hilltowns including waterfalls and natural rock formations. We will also speak about "history hiking" going back to the 18-1900's early settler development in the hills including the western railroad, mills and mines. Please register with the library.

Hawk Watch— Saturday, September 25 at 9am— Join the Allen Bird Club's John Weeks atop Granville's beautiful Blueberry Hill. At this outdoor library program, you'll enjoy fresh air and soulcentering views while spotting majestic birds of prey as they ride air currents toward their winter migratory homes. Sensible footwear, bug and tick prevention, and the ability to walk up a moderate, quarter mile incline are necessary. Blueberry Hill is on North Lane (off route 57) in Granville and is searchable on Google Maps. All participants must sign a waiver, and those under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. *Registration required*.


